Introduction: When Jesus gathered with His disciples in the Upper Room the night before His crucifixion He did so to celebrate and remember an event in Jewish history that had taken place some 1400 years earlier. They were remembering the time when God had broken through time and history to deliver His people from their slavery in Egypt. God's people should never forget God's deliverance from bondage. To this very day the Jews remember that special time in their history by celebrating the Passover.

Every year on December 7th Americans remember an historic event- an event which brought them into the Second World War – the attack by the Japanese on Pearl Harbor. This year commemorates the 75th anniversary of that historic event. In honor of the veterans one writer wrote – “It is our duty to continue to honor the past, inspire the future and educate all so that veterans are assured that their fight was not in vain”.

Jesus gave His followers a new reason to remember and celebrate – God's deliverance of His people, Jew and Gentile, from their bondage to sin and death by the “breaking” of the Body and shedding of the Blood of God's Perfect Passover Lamb, Jesus Himself. All who know the Lord are invited to come and remember our Lord's death in the breaking of bread and drinking of the grape juice at this, the Lord's Table.
