**Introduction:** The central figure in the Book of Revelation is Jesus Christ - Who also is the central figure in all of history. It is easy to see that the point of chapter one is to focus our attention upon Jesus, especially in the verses before us this morning. By faith Moses was able to endure "as seeing Him Who is invisible" and Peter writing to believers in the first century was able to say, concerning Christ, "Whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy unspeakable", and again in Hebrews we are exhorted, "Looking unto Jesus the Author and Finisher of our faith..." Believers in Jesus Christ are called to live as seeing Him Who is invisible for the Christian life cannot be lived without continuous focusing upon Him.
